



Articulation Agreement -3 + 1 Agreement

The South College School of Pharmacy (SCSOP), desiring to facilitate the application process for students desiring to pursue the Doctor of Pharmacy degree, hereby enters into the following agreement with Union College.

Definitions

PharmCAS – centralized application service through which applicants apply to SCSOP Initial Screening – review process by which applicants are selected for interview Admissions Interview – on-site face-to-face interview of an applicant by members of the SCSOP admissions committee

Terms and Conditions

- 1. Students must complete the prerequisite coursework for admission to SCSOP as specified in the attachment to this agreement.
- 2. Students must achieve a minimum 3.00 grade point average on said prerequisite coursework and receive no grade below a C in any prerequisite course.
- Students meeting the foregoing conditions shall be exempted from initial screening and will be guaranteed an admissions interview for the Summer Quarter entering class.
- 4. The foregoing notwithstanding, this agreement provides no assurances of admission for any student applying under this agreement.
- SCSOP reserves the sole right to approve courses comprising the applicable prerequisite
 coursework. The Union College pre-pharmacy advisor shall notify SCSOP admissions of
 any desired substitutions or changes to any of the courses comprising the prerequisite
 coursework.
- SCSOP reserves the sole right to modify the grade point average criteria; however, the criteria in effect at the time of a student's initial enrollment at Union College shall be applicable for that student.
- 7. Union College agrees that the successful completion of the first year of South College School of Pharmacy by a qualified applicant who becomes a SCSOP student will qualify him or her for a bachelor's degree from Union College. South College retains the sole right to determine whether a SCSOP student has successfully completed the first year of Pharmacy

- School, and that determination will be based on satisfactory completion of all regular academic requirements and the absence of any conduct that would prevent the student from continuing his or her program at South College.
- 8. Union College agrees to keep the student's academic record active during the student's first year at South College School of Pharmacy. If a student is academically dismissed from SCSOP during or immediately after completion of the student's first year he or she will be allowed to finish his or her undergraduate degree at Union College without reapplication for admission to the extent consistent with Union College policy regarding good standing and active/inactive status

Eligibility and Process

- Students are expected to declare their intent to apply for admission to SCSOP through the
 Union College pre-pharmacy advisor by the end of the semester that immediately precedes
 the semester during which the student plans to apply. Students planning to apply in the
 Spring of their junior year will need to notify their advisor of intent to apply by the end of the
 junior year Fall semester.
- Students are required to submit a PharmCAS application, along with supporting materials, by the SCSOP's normal application deadline. The annual application deadline is typically June 1st, but can vary based on the institutional options provided by PharmCAS each application cycle.
- Student must contact the Union College pre-pharmacy advisor for certification as meeting the aforementioned criteria.
- 4. The SCSOP admissions office shall contact the student upon receipt of all application materials, including certification, to schedule an admissions interview. The applicant will be contacted regarding an interview within one month of the submission of all required application materials.

Effective

This agreement shall become effective upon signing by the appropriate individuals at both institutions, and shall remain in effect until terminated by either party.

The agreement shall be reviewed periodically, but at least once every 3 years, with adjustments being made as appropriate. Such adjustments shall not apply retroactively unless agreed upon by both parties.

The agreement may be cancelled by either party with ninety (90) days written notice; however, the opportunity shall be available to any student who was enrolled (and remained continuously enrolled) at Union College while the agreement was in effect.
